Centre description

We welcome your students to Frankfurt-Sachsenhausen! Your students (13-17 years) will have a great time in one of the most cosmopolitan towns in Germany! They'll be taught in our summer school for juniors located in Sachsenhausen, only a few minutes from the heart of the city.

Students can choose between home stay accommodation and residential accommodation in town. The residences we use are a short walk or bus-ride away from school.

Activities take place in the school and town. During the day the students have access to a large amount of leisure facilities.

In peak season we have up to 60 students in the centre.

Students mainly come from France, Italy, United States & Canada and Eastern European countries. That means that our students will experience a multicultural environment and German will be the main language of communication.

A large choice of activities is offered in school and residence. Please see sample programme for details.

Of course, students are under the permanent supervision of our International Team (normally, one supervisor is responsible for 15 students). Further information about the team members and the languages that are spoken by the team are available prior to departure.

How to get to Frankfurt?

- By flight: Airport transfer from Frankfurt International airport is included in the price. On the day of arrival our Meet & Greet-Service welcomes each student at the airport and ensures a safe transfer to the centre. On the day of departure, we will bring you to the check-in desk. Meet & Greet Service and transfer are offered from Frankfurt International Airport (transfer takes 20 minutes).
- By train: The transfer from Frankfurt main station is included in the price. On your arrival, we will meet you at the train station and bring you to your accommodation.

General Information

- The easiest way is to bring currency in Euros. Please change dollars at the airport or train station before arrival in Frankfurt.
- Pocket money transfer: at the post office or Western Union money transfer
- Public transport: not necessary

School description

Situation

- Near the town centre (a few minutes' walk)
- Situated in Sachsenhausen, the most elegant district
- Bank, Post-office and supermarkets are located in town
- Sports facilities in town



Facilities

- Café bar in school
- veranda

Residential Accommodation

- Multi-bedded rooms (2-4 bedded rooms) with a few shared toilet and shower facilities on each floor.
- Students will share a room with peers of the same sex. If possible, they will also share a room with students speaking another native language (unless they request to stay with a friend), but please bear in mind, that this may not always be practical.
- Rooms are lockable with a magnet card and there is one card per student
- Big cupboards, not lockable
- Damage deposit 50 €
- Bedding is provided and changed weekly, students should only bring towels for swimming, towels in the residence will be provided
- Cleaning of rooms once a week
- Public phone booths are in the residences
- Plug adaptor is necessary for international students
- No safe but secure storage of valuables available in the reception office.
- Students are not allowed to leave the centre without at least one member of staff



Meal plan

All students enjoy a full board meal service. Vegetarian options provided.

- Breakfast: 07.30 – 9.00 (continental breakfast)
- Lunch: 12.30 - 14.00 (Packed lunch)
- Dinner: 18.00 - 18.30 (warm dishes)



Home stay accommodation

- in Frankfurt. Max. 45 minutes by bus from school.
- All our hosts respect our strict home stay guideline and are carefully chosen by our local Welfare Manager.
- Students get breakfast and dinner and packed lunches.
- Bedding: Provided and changed weekly
- Towels: not provided
- Students can receive phone calls in the private home, public phone booths are on the campus and in town.
- A reasonable amount of laundry is included in the household wash.
- Students will share a room with peers of the same sex. If possible, they will also share a room with students of their age speaking another native language (unless they request to stay with a friend), but please bear in mind, that this may not always be practical.
- Normally, we don't place more than four students in one private home, but in peak times more than four students might be placed in one home.
- Access to the household in the afternoon and evenings
- Hosts assist students with travel between home and school on the first day of school

Lessons

- Take place in the school (address see above)
- **Test** on the 1st day at 9.00, class allocation at 11.00
- **Certificate** at the end of the course
- **Courses available:** Intensive German Course (20 lessons per week)
- All our courses follow the European Framework of reference levels
- **Levels on offer:** elementary (A1), lower intermediate (A2), intermediate (B1), upper intermediate (B2), advanced (C1)
- There are no more than **15 students** in one learning group. Normally, these students are of different mother tongue and of nearly the same age.
- All teachers are **native speakers** and are experienced in teaching German as a foreign language
- **Lesson times:** 1st lesson: 9.00-10.30; Break: 10.30-11.00; 2nd lesson: 11.00-12.30

Supervision

Our friendly and helpful team with German or German speaking staff members will run a fully supervised activity programme and guarantee supervision.

There is one supervisor responsible for 15 students. The members of our team have been carefully selected for their responsible and caring attitude and for being fun-loving and outgoing. They are the people your students can turn to at any time for assistance.
